

Grade 11

Our Student Success Plan is built around three core components: Academic (A), Career (C), and Personal/Social Development (P/S).

PSAT (A, C)

Communication is sent home regarding test registration, and students register through the guidance office.

Naviance College Search (A, C)

Students complete college search and explore college data in Naviance.

Naviance Parent Training (A, C)

Parents are educated on the use of Naviance and its features and functions.

Post-High School Planning (A, C, P/S)

In continuation of the post-high school planning process, counselors conduct a classroom-based developmental counseling lesson with eleventh grade students. This coincides with an evening program for parents, which includes a large-group presentation to all parents and small-group breakout session with the child's counselor. At the end of junior year, counselors meet with their assigned students in a small-group setting to review progress to date and timeline for summer/fall of senior year.

Individual Post-High School Planning (A, C, P/S)

Counselors meet individually with each student and his or her family to discuss all aspects of the post-high school planning process and together devise a specific plan on how to proceed for each student.

Individual Educational Planning Meetings (A, C, P/S)

Students meet individually with their counselor to review junior year progress and select courses for the following year. Course selection is personalized based on a student's individual academic progress, interests, and post-high school goals. Students then have an opportunity to resolve schedule difficulties later in the school year, if necessary.

College Panel Night (A, P/S)

Eleventh grade students and parents have an opportunity to become acquainted with the specifics of the college admission process by listening to college admission representatives.

College Essay/Personal Statement and Interview Workshop (A, C, P/S)

Students receive instruction on composing a successful college essay/personal statement and how to interview effectively.

Job Shadow Program (A, C, P/S)

Students have the opportunity to learn more about a specific career of interest by shadowing someone working in that field for a day.

New Student/Parent Orientation (A, P/S)

Students new to the district and their parents attend New Student/Parent Orientation at the beginning of the school year. Students may participate in a new student group with a school counselor.

Parent Roundtable (A, P/S)

Parents have the opportunity to attend a meeting by grade level that is topical based on the social-emotional and developmental appropriate needs of the students.

504 and PPT Meetings (A, C, P/S)

Annual meetings are held for identified students for the purpose of individualized educational planning. Post-high school education/training goals and objectives are developed for students with an IEP.

Back to School Night (A, P/S)

Parents follow their child's schedule to meet teachers and learn about the planned curriculum and expectations for each subject.
